This groundbreaking documentary spotlights the stories of nine unforgettable girls, born into unforgiving circumstances -- it captures their dreams, their voices, and their remarkable lives. The film features narration by Hollywood personalities such as Anne Hathaway, Cate Blanchett, Liam Neeson and Meryl Streep. It is also a movement dedicated to empowering and achieving educational equity for girls around the world.

Dr. Patricia E. Neudecker, former superintendent of the Oconomowoc Area School District, will be leading a discussion immediately following the film screening with audience members.
