Campaign Financing in Wisconsin

Presentation by Mike McCabe, Director, Wisconsin Democracy

Mike McCabe is the director of the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign, a nonpartisan watchdog group that tracks the money in state elections and works for reforms aimed at making people matter more than money in politics. Mike is also author of *Blue Jeans in High Places: The Coming Makeover of American Politics*, copies of which will be available at the meeting.

Mike grew up on his family's dairy farm and went on to study at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, earning degrees in journalism and political science. He joined the Democracy Campaign's staff in 1999 and became the group's director in 2000.

Mike worked as the communications director and legislative liaison for the Madison Metropolitan School District. He previously directed a statewide civic education program for the nonpartisan Wisconsin Taxpayers Alliance and worked as a newspaper reporter and legislative aide. Mike also served in the Peace Corps in the West African country of Mali.

Wisconsin Democracy Campaign was founded in 1995 as a nonprofit, independent coalition of individuals and groups responding to the growing dominance of special interest money in the campaigns of state lawmakers.

Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker

In *Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker*, novelist Jennifer Chiaverini presents a stunning account of the friendship that blossomed between Mary Todd Lincoln and her seamstress, Elizabeth "Lizzie" Keckley, a former slave. Keckley gained her professional reputation in Washington, D.C. by outfitting the city's elite. She made history by sewing for First Lady Mary Todd Lincoln within the White House, a trusted witness to many private moments between the President and his wife, two of the most compelling figures in American history.
